The Saatchi Gallery partners with the Jack Petchey Foundation and Children & the Arts to work on the Start Programme. This exciting programme gives students between the ages of 11 and 18 the opportunity to explore the Saatchi Gallery's cutting edge contemporary art, hear exhibiting artists talk about their work and life, and work with professional artists to create their own artwork inspired by what they have seen at the Gallery. The project culminates in a student exhibition at the Saatchi Gallery.

Start Programme Aims:

- Introducing young people to the arts
- Inspiring them to learn more
- Enhancing their experience through critical analysis and participation
- Encouraging them to create their own art.

"At the heart of *Start* is the desire to make cultural venues accessible for a new generation."

The broad aim of the project is to introduce high quality contemporary art to students in a way that is inspiring, engaging and challenging.

We aim to equip students with the tools they need to explore art exhibitions, so that they may feel confident in visiting galleries.

We aim to expose the workings and processes of practising artists to the students through direct contact with professional artists.

We aim to give teachers a gratifying experience where new ideas can be tested and be influential on their teaching.

People

We work with 450 students from outer-London state schools and 5 project artists. Each artist works with 90 students from 3 different schools.

All of our artists have worked extensively with a wide range of young people, schools, museums, galleries and communities. Each artist has their own practice which spans drawing, sculpture, painting, film and performance.

Project elements

<u>Introductory evening</u>- Artists and teachers gather at the Saatchi Gallery to meet each other and find out more about the project


<u>In-gallery workshops</u>- School students visit the Saatchi Gallery for their first artist-led workshop

<u>CPD for Art Teachers</u>- Teachers are invited to the Saatchi Gallery for 2 artist-led workshops focusing on developing artistic skills and supporting creative pedagogy

<u>In-school workshops</u>- Artists visit their assigned schools to deliver a series of workshops

<u>Artist talks</u>- Students listen to Saatchi Gallery exhibiting artists talk about their work in situ, and take part in a Q&A session

<u>Final exhibition and visit to the Saatchi Gallery</u>- Students visit the Saatchi Gallery to view an exhibition of their artwork alongside Saatchi Gallery exhibitions

There is a different project theme each year. Students and artists respond to this theme throughout the project. In Year 1 the theme was *Migration*, Year 2 *Transformation* and in Year 3 *Inclusion*. The artist-led activities during the introductory evening are designed to get teachers/artists thinking about the project theme and how the project may be shaped.
